

Provisional Timetable

The timetable running up to the EPPM 2012 conference is essential to ensure adequate time is available to produce full proceedings at the time of the conference. Every paper will be subjected to rigorous refereeing before it is accepted for publication in the proceedings.

Submission of Abstract and Paper

The abstract and papers should be submitted via email to eppm2012@brighton.ac.uk.

Abstracts should normally be between 150-300 words accompanied by up to 5 keywords. Full papers must not exceed 12 sides of A4 in a format as shown in the template provided. Each paper will be refereed by at least two reviewers. If the paper is accepted, it is expected that at least one of the authors attends the conference to present the paper. A Best Paper Award will be given to the best paper presented at the conference. High quality papers will be recommended for publication in the International Journal of Engineering, Project, and Production Management.



Brighton and Hove is one of the most vibrant, colourful and creative cities in Europe. The University of Brighton

Brighton and Hove is a recognised conference destination, both nationally and internationally and it's easy to see why with its mix of seaside charm and city vibrancy. Brighton and Hove has a lot to offer conference delegates for both business and pleasure, is under an hour away from London and only half an hour from Gatwick Airport. The university has 3 different campuses in Brighton. The School of Environment and Technology (comprising built environment, civil engineering, geography and geology) is located at the University of Brighton's Moulsecoomb campus which has its own train station about 5 minutes on the train heading east of Brighton mainline station.

The University of Brighton is a community of over 23,000 students and 2,600 staff based on five campuses in Brighton, Eastbourne and Hastings. We can trace our origins back to the mid-19th century in Brighton and the mid-20th century in Eastbourne. The last Research Assessment Exercise (RAE) found more Brighton academics working at international standards of excellence that any other post-1992 university. All these are factors which contribute to our reputation as a leading post-1992 university in the United Kingdom.

State of the art facilities have been booked at the newly opened Huxley Building. The building, which normally provides specialist facilities for the School of Pharmacy and Biomolecular Sciences, includes a green roof and solar panels. It houses the university's largest lecture theatre with a seating capacity for 400 people. It also includes multipurpose seminar rooms with moveable walls which can be booked for the duration of the conference. Details of the building can be found here. Transportation

East Sussex is situated in the south-east of England. Brighton is 90 km from London. Travel links are excellent. The M25/M23 motorway link provides easy road access to London and the rest of the country, whilst mainland Europe is a short journey by air, train or ship on the Eurostar or ferries across the Channel to France. Train journey times from Brighton to London Victoria: 55 minutes and from Brighton to London Gatwick Airport: 30 minutes.


